


- 1. (UNCLASSIFIED) WOQ/BWQ Billeting in Buildings 305 and 307, Keystone Area. The following policies will be applicable for company grade female officers and civilian women personnel to be housed in the Keystone Area:
- a. Building 307 will be used to house female company grade officers and all GS-9 GS-11 civilian women personnel. It is understood that consideration is being given to changing the staging area from Building 303 to Building 307. If this change is effected, the plan indicated for Building 307 for women personnel will apply in Building 303.
- b. In Building 307, separate the wall lockers and two (2) cabinets presently serving as the wall partition into four (4) separate movable units. These units may be detached in such a manner that they are movable to locations acceptable to the occupant.
- c. Building 305 will continue to be used without modification for civilian women employees, GS-7 and below, unless a request is made by two individuals desiring to share the modified type rooms.
- d. The civilian women school teachers, GS-7's, arriving on 22 August 1957, who are in excess to the billets available in Building 305, will be housed in the Wing area.
- e. The presently employed GS-6's and below, living in the Keystone area, will be billeted in Building 305.
- f. The party room in Building 307 will be eliminated. The Kadena Officers Club provides adequate facilities for the party room requirements.
- g. Civilian women employees who avail themselves of off-base housing or private rentals and maintain their requirement for one room on the base, will be provided with a room in the Wing area.

At 0900 hours, 22 July 1957, representatives of this headquarters, USARYIS/IX Corps, USAMD, USCAR, USA Ordnance Group, and the 546th ASSC met in conference at USAED to discuss the proposed transfer from Army to Air Force of 343 acres lying within the northeast approach zone to the Kadena runways. The area under consideration is highly contaminated with Japanese and American ordnance materiel in an amount estimated at 100 tons per acre, with the entire amount being beneath the ground surface. Explosive Ordnance Demolition personnel seriously doubt that the area could ever be cleared to the extent that it could be released to its native owners. It was further estimated that clearance to a three-foot depth would require utilisation of an entire Ordnance Disposal Company for a period of one year. Fires are generated in the area - principally from white phosphorous sources - on an average of over 300 a year. The armual lease value of the area is about \$18,300. The Air Force has a requirement for the area based on prevention of violation of the approach surface which lies above it, while the only Army requirement for the area is based on the fact that it cannot be released to its indigenous owners because of the contamination. While final decision on the proposed transfer lies within the authority of higher headquarters, it will be recommended that the Army retain its present leasehold interest and attempt to obtain a "Determinable Estate" in the area.

(SECRET) During his recent visit to this headquarters, Lt. Col. P. E. White, Headquarters PACAF Requirements and Programs Chief, ACS/I, indicated that the USAF Ad Hoc Committee had approved the Kadena Missile Site projects for a maximum total estimated cost of \$5,000,000. Our most recent submission carried an estimated cost of \$8,427,000. Col. White suggested that the projects be carefully reviewed at this headquarters and that detailed site plans be prepared. Col. The Comptrollers of Naha and Kadena Air Base, along with members of their staff, attended an informal conference lasting the entire morning. A number of items were discussed chief among which were:

- 1. Every effort will be made at the two bases of this command to charge personnel costs and equipment and supply costs, such as oxygen and acetylene, against the scrap and salvage account rather than to local 458 funds. In this matter local 458 funds will be available for base operations and maintenance.
- 2. A TWX received this date from Headquarters Fifth Air Force directing capitalization of the clothing stock fund was discussed. It will be necessary to retroactively charge to local 458 funds for clothing expenditures for individuals since 1 July. The exact sum involved at each base is not known at this time. However, such action will further aggravate our shortage of local 458 funds. Comptroller and Director of Materiel cooperation will be required to accomplish capitalization.
- 3. The subject of reimbursement for overhead costs now being demanded by the Army was discussed. The PACAF personnel agreed that we should not reimburse the Army for overhead personnel and other costs for which the Army has been funded by Congress, inasmuch as the Army requested the money and so informed Congress for support of a good many of the Cross Servicing areas involved.
- 4. It was pointed out by the PACAF representative that the Air Force should look into any further agreements such as Large Charge Project for reimbursement to local funds from Military Assistance Program funds. This would further conserve local available 458 funds.
- 5. The possibility of having the Army bill the Navy directly for electricity and water consumed at Naha Air Base was discussed and was agreed that this possibility would be explored.
- 6. The subject of GSSF items was discussed. No solutions to all the problems involved were worked out; however, numerous problems were itemized for attention and were discussed.
- 7. The subject of payment of transportation of aviation fuel was discussed. Neither Kadena nor Naha Air Base have the same problem as certain other bases within PACAF, inasmuch as we utilize pipelines or our own transportation. It was pointed out that any contract carrier which might use should be charged to the POL stock funds.

- 8. It is requested by the PACAF personnel that answers from the bases and division to the following questions be provided by separate subsequent letter:
- a. What impact has the imposition of expenditure limitations had on our bases.
- b. What did we do locally in order to remain within the expenditure ceiling, ie, what devices such as cuts and/or controls have been imposed.
- c. What procedure would we recommend to allow us to stay within expenditure ceilings by programming our expenditure over 12 to 18 month period.
