ORGANIZATION - FIELD

313th Air Division

1. References:

a. AFR 20-1, Organization Principles and policies for the USAF.

b. AFR 20-27, Organization, Designation and Control of AF Units.

- c. PACAFR 23-9, Fifth Air Force.
- d. 5AFR 55-18, Division Areas of Responsibility.

2. <u>Purpose</u>. To state the mission and organization of the 313th Air Division and responsibilities of the Commander.

3. General:

a. The mission of the 13th Air Division is to conduct defensive and support offensive operations in the Division's operating areas and the area adjacent thereto, as delineated in 5AFR 55-18.

b. The 313th Air Division is a constituted unit activated under an appropriate Unit Manning Document, with non-T/O manpower authorization, assigned to Fifth Air Force. To carry out its mission and responsibilities, it is provided a headquarters and such other units and facilities as are considered necessary by the Commander, Fifth Air Force and approved by CINCPACAF.

4. <u>Responsibilities</u>. The Commander, 313th Air Division, will exercise command control over all units assigned or attached. He will be directly responsible to Commander, Fifth Air Force, for:

a. Conducting air defense of the assigned area of responsibility.

b. Logistic support of Fifth Air Force tactical units stationed on, or deployed to, bases within the Air Division's area of responsibility, to insure maximum operational readiness and EWP capability.

c. Organization, administration, training, equipping, and preparation for combat of assigned and attached units.

d. Planning and conducting joint training and operations with friendly forces.

e. Development of tactics and techniques of aerial varfare.

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f. Exercising operational control over all Army antiaircraft (AAA) units for air defense, operational control of Naval and Marine AAA units when shore-based, and control of AAA gunfire from ships' batteries when such fire is in support of defense of shore installations within the air defense sector.

g. Operational control of all shore-based Naval and Marine fighter aircraft made available for air defense or offensive operations.

h. Supporting Strategic Air Command operations.

i. Support of special activities, tenant and/or attached units.

j. Controlling the utilization of air space, civil and military air traffic, and electromagnetic radiation within the limits of assigned areas.

k. Establish and monitor disaster control measures in his area of responsibility.

1. Issuing mission directives for all assigned units.

- m. In the Ryukyu Islands:
 - Coordinating with appropriate local United States governmental authorities, all Air Force activities which have an impact on the civil economy or affect civil activities.
 - (2) Coordinating with appropriate local Army and Navy commanders to insure uninterrupted operations of jointly used utilities and installations.
- n. Supporting the High Commissioner of the Ryukyu Islands in the discharge of United States Civil Administration responsibilities, except as otherwise prohibited.
- o. Operating and maintaining all bomb and gunnery ranges within 313th Air Division area of responsibility.
- p. Executing all directives as may be assigned by the Commander, Fifth Air Force and higher headquarters.
- q. Preparation, coordination, and implementation of general emergency plans, contingency plans, and other operation plans or orders as directed by Commander, Fifth Air Force.

5. Miscellaneous. On matters pertaining to the mission and responsibilities of the Air Division, the Commander, 313th Air Division, is authorized to communicate directly with other Fifth Air Force subordinate and friendly force commanders, except as otherwise directed by this or higher headquarters. 0919555FCAG

1. <u>Purpose</u>: To prescribe the mission and responsibilities of the 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron.

2. <u>Scope:</u> This directive is applicable to the 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron (Ryukyus AC&W System).

3. <u>Wission</u>: To conduct the Aircraft Control and Warning activities of the Ryukyus Air Defense System as outlined in 313th Air Division Regulation 55-18.

4. <u>Organization</u>: The 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron is organized as a non-table of organization unit directly subordinate to the 313th Air Division. It is provided with a headquarters and five (5) detachments.

5. <u>Responsibilities</u>: The Commander, 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron is directly responsible to the Commander, 313th Air Division for:

a. An alternate Air Defense Control Center.

b. Reporting AC&W operational information as required.

c. Operation and maintenance of assigned radar, radio, telephone, teletype and associated equipment and areas.

d. Security, as required, of assigned facilities, equipment and areas.

e. Emergency medical treatment and routine medical care for assigned personnel as required.

f. Coordinating Site Concurrence Letters (TO 31-1-8) with the Commander, 6431st Air Base Group.

g. Computing budget requirements for organizational operations.

h. Personnel administration as required.

i. Supply functions as required.

j. Preventive Maintenance as directed.

6. <u>Direct Communications</u>: The Commander, 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron is authorized direct communications with all staff sections, Headquarters 313th Air Division. Direct communication with all units subordinate to this headquarters is authorized for the conduct of routine air defense matters. Direct communication other than specified above will be accomplished only when specific approval is granted.

1. <u>Purpose</u>: To establish air defense unit operational alignment and functions with the Okinawa Air Defense System.

2. <u>Scope</u>: This regulation is applicable to all units assigned or attached to 313th Air Division for air defense.

3. <u>General</u>: The Combat Operations Division is the command post from which the Division Commander directs the air defense of Okinawa. It is staffed and operated by Detachment 1, 313th Air Division. The Division Commander retains the over-all control of Detachment 1, 313th Air Division, its subsections and 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron. However, the operational control is vested in the Commander, 51st Fighter Interceptor Wing, who, in effect, becomes third in command in matters pertaining to the defense of the 313th Air Division area of responsibility and will act in that capacity in the absence of the division commander or director of eperations. The 51st Fighter Interceptor Wing Commander will submit letter of evaluation to the Director of Operations on the Detachment 1 Commander and to the 313th Air Division Commander on the 623d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron Commander to be used in preparation of Officer Evaluation Reports.

4. <u>Geographical Boundaries</u>: Okinawa Sector: For Air Defense purposes the fellowing area will be considered the Okinawa sector:

> 30°00' N-123°00' E 30°00'N-145°00'E 23°00'N-132°00'E 23°00'N-123°00'E

5. Functional Responsibilities:

a. Functions and responsibilities of the Air Division Combat Operations Division (COD): 313ADR 55-18

(1) Exercises operational control of fighter units, anti-aircraft artillery in gun defended areas and other forces for air defense, to include scheduling, maintaining and reporting of daily flying training and controller activities.

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(2) Supervises the Control Center in the day-to-day operation of aircraft control and warning, and air defense warning systems, and the allocation thereto of elements of forces for air defense to satisfy current requirements.

(3) Directs the employment of measures required to destroy or neutralize hostile aircraft.

(4) Recommends point-to-point and air/ground communications necessary to employ operationally all elements of the sector air defense system.

(5) Evaluates all available intelligence on energy and/or unidentified air movements in or toward the sector and disseminate pertinent information through the air defense system to agencies authorized to receive such intelligence.

(6) Directs the issuance of air defense warnings to certain military commanders in accordance with approved air defense warning plans.

(7) Directs the use of measures to deceive, confuse, or deny aid to the enemy, including the implementation of the SCAT plan and/or CONELRAD, as ordered by higher headquarters.

(8) Makes recommendations for the over-all requirements for air defense elements, including fighter units and AAA.

(9) Coordinates operations with and in support of adjacent Air Division Combat Operations Divisions.

(10) Prepares and submits recommendations to satisfy the current requirements of the Air Defense situation.

(11) Establishes procedures which will insure the continued air defense of the sector in the event of the whole or partial destruction of the COD or the Control Center. To implement these procedures as the occasion requires.

(12) Receives and disseminates operational orders, plans, and instructions as directed.

(13) Prepares and publishes daily operations orders and amendments thereto for all Air Defense units under the operational control of the division.

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b. Functions and responsibilities of the O&T Division (3130C-T):

313ADR 55-18

(1) The O&T Division has certain staff functions for air defense. It is the agency responsible for recommending to the Division Commander through the Director of Operations, plans, policies, and procedures for the:

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(a) Air defense of the assigned area to include operation of AC&W system, air defense warning systems, anti-aircraft system.

(b) Identification of aircraft penetrating organized air defenses in the assigned area of responsibility and the employment of measures required to destroy or neutralize hostile (Net identified as friendly) aircraft as directed by appropriate higher authority.

(c) Provision of space and facilities at each air defense control installation for use by liaison representatives from the Army, Navy, Air Force, and other authorised agencies.

(d) Collection, evaluation and display at air defense control installations of all available intelligence on enemy and unidentified air movements in or toward the organized air defense area to serve as the basis for the dissemination of information to authorized agencies.

(e) Issuance of air defense warnings.

(f) Control of measures to deceive, confuse, or deny aid to the enemy, as directed by higher headquarters.

(g) Designation of the state of preparedness for all air defense elements, including fighter units and anti-aircraft artillery gun defended areas and inner artillery sones.


(h) Coordination of operations with and in support of adjacent Air Divisions.

(1) Conduct of air defense exercises, maneuvers, and combined operations.

(j) Establishment of prohibited and restricted areas over which aircraft, except specified military aircraft under certain conditions, are forbidden to operate.

(k) Maintenance of current status, operational information and operational records, and submission of operational reports.

(1) Participation in the air defense training of elements over which operational control is, or will be exercised upon agreement with or at the request of the commander, or in accordance with directives from higher headquarters.

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(m) Establishment of and monitoring of training programs of air defense units to accomplish the air defense mission.

c. The functions and responsibilities of the Air Defense Control Center (ADCC) are:

(1) Collect and display pertinent information on air activities and the status of forces for air defense within a sector.

(2) Disseminate specific air intelligence to the Division Combat Opeations Division, adjacent Air Defense Control Centers, Air Defense Direction Centers, Fifth Air Force Combat Operations Center, and other authorised agencies.

(3) Monitor the implementation of movement-identification procedures as prescribed by pertinent directives.

(4) Coordinate the activities of all other forces for air defense operating within the sector, exercising such control as has been delegated by Chief of Combat Operations or his authorised representative.

(5) Exercises operational control of such point-to-point and air-ground communication facilities, maintained by the Communication Section of the 6431st Operations Squadron, as are necessary in the collection of data and the dissemination of intelligence.

(6) Supervise the utilisation of all means available to eliminate or minimize the effects of electronic counter measures upon the system.

(7) Provides operations information, records, and operations reports for the COD.

(8) Provides such space, facilities, and information as necessary for liaison representatives from the Army, Navy, Air Force, and other authorised agencies that are assigned to duty, with the Division, at the ADCC.

(9) Transmits Air Defense Warnings in accordance with approved air raid warning plans when so directed by proper authority.

(10) Function as a Sub-Rescue Coordinating Center under Fifth Air Force Rescue Coordinating Center (COC) on all matters pertaining to rescue activities as required or directed within the Okinawa ADIZ area of responsibility.

(11) Establishes 313th Air Division Typhoon Command Post when required.

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(12) Functions as radiological evaluation and warning center for the Okinawa complex or ADIZ.

d. The functions and responsibilities of the Air Defense Direction Center (ADDC) are:

(1) Responsible for the Tactical Air Defense activities of the sector to which assigned.

(2) Operate the surveillance equipment with which the installation is provided.

(3) Collects, evaluates, and displays pertinent information on air activities within the assigned sector, including radar intelligence from other air defense radars in the sector.

(4) Disseminates specific air intelligence to the Air Defense Centrol Center, adjacent Air Defense Direction Centers, and other authorized agencies.

(5) Identifies air activities within or penetrating the sector.

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(6) Scrambles and controls fighter aircraft for the air interception of targets or passes control of fighters to satellite surveillance stations for completion of the intercept mission.

(7) Controls fighter aircraft passed into the Sector by adjacent Direction Centers and assists in the interception of designated targets when directed by the Control Center or requested by adjacent Direction Centers.

(8) Coordinates and controls all other forces for air defense operating with the Sector, as directed.

(9) Operates point-to-point and air-ground communication facilities used in the employment of allotted forces for air defense.

(10) Maintains a specified alert status of forces for air defense assigned or allocated to the Sector.

(11) Provides information, records, and operation reports, as directed.

(12) Provides the necessary space, facilities, and information to liaison representatives from Army, Navy, Air Force and other suthorized agencies that may be assigned for duty.

(13) Transmits air defense warning to specified military commander in accordance with approved plans, when directed by proper authority.

(14) Assists aircraft on air defense missions, and other friendly aircraft when possible, in avoiding storms, hasardous terrain, restricted areas and anti-aircraft artillery defended sones, and furnishing advisories to aircraft off course.

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(15) Cooperates with and assists rescue units operating within the Sector.

(16) Utilizes all direct means to minimize or eliminate effects of jamming or interference caused by weather or electronics disturbances.

e. Intercept/Surveillance Station: The function of an intercept/ surveillance station is to extend intercept capability (direction), surveillance coverage, and navigational assistance to aircraft in flight in the parent direction center's sector. In addition, it operates passive detection and ground based jamming equipment when available.

f. Surveillance Station: The function of the surveillance station is the same for the intercept/surveillance station except it does not perform the intercept function.

6. <u>Interceptor and Fighter Forces</u>: All-weather interceptors and other designated fighter units are responsible for the interception and destruction of hostile aircraft. Control and direction are provided by the ADDC and ADCC.

7. <u>Anti-Aircraft Artillery</u>: Army Anti-Aircraft Artillery and Defense missile units allocated for air defense, Navy and Marine Corps weapons when under the operational control of this division, will be responsible for providing close-in protection from air attacks. Control of these units is provided by the ADDC as directed by the ADCC.

8. ACW Unit Alignment:

a. P-52: Primary function intercept surveillance station responsible to P-56, secondary function alternate ADDC.

b. P-53: Primary function surveillance station, responsible to P-56.

c. P-54: Primary function intercept surveillance station, responsible to P-56.

d. P-55: Primary function surveillance station, responsible to P-56.

e. P-56: Primary function ADDC, responsible for entire Sector. Secondary function alternate ADCC and COD.

Agreement was reached during this conference for both Kadena and Naha Bases. Lt Colonel Robertson agreed to attempt to obtain Fifth Air Force allotment of funds for one project which the air installations personnel of Fifth Air Force had informed him would not be funded this quarter. (UNCLAS) A letter has been received from USARYIS by the 6313th Air Base Wing and by the 6431st Air Base Group concerning forecasts for reimbursable ordinance support for the 1959 Army Budget Execution Plan (called "Financial Plan" by the Air Force.) Coordination was effected between Kadena and Naha Bases with USARYIS and with the Materiel Directorate of the Division. During this fiscal year, USARYIS has repeatedly attempted to charge the bases of this command so-called

"overhead charges" in connection with cross-servicing agreements. In addition, USARYIS has requested reimbursement for a pro-rata share of RNU support for what they term "common use facilities" such as wharves and approaches, POL system, warehouse and open storage areas. and island-wide facilities. This Division has consistently resisted the payment of these charges which we consider unauthorized. A letter was received on the 10th of March 1958 stating that USARYIS concurs in principle with our earlier position for FY 58. They state, however, that the Army Budget Execution Directive (Financial Plan Directive) for FY 1959 directs that they seek recoupment for costs incurred by virtue of provided support to other DOD agencies, and they have requested that we program and budget for common use facilities and accessorial charges for supply support for FY 59. The Army informs us that they intend to place an overhead charge of 16% (sixteen percent) on supplies which we purchase from them and that they are requesting we budget for \$220,156 as a pro-rata share of the R&U support for common use facilities. The overhead charges would approximate \$675,581. In addition, the Army states that they have been directed to seek reimbursement for Air Force and Navy occupancy of MCA surplus and GARIOA housing. USARYIS indicates they will advise us later of their proposed charges, and they state that they are drafting an agreement for our review, comment, and/or concurrence. At this point in time, it remains the Division position that these unauthorized charges will not be paid. Fifth Air Force and the bases of this command have been kept fully informed of the developments in this regard and are being furnished copies of this latest letter from the Army. This headquarters directed earlier in the year that the bases provide funding at least ten percent over catalogue prices in order to expedite purchases. In addition, the bases had authorized SMAMA to deliver amounts less than ordered in order to expedite purchases.

On 15 April, during the course of a Fifth Air Force Comptroller Conference, Colonel Walker, Comptroller SMAMA, and Colonel Coolidge, Director of Procurement, SMAMA, presented an analysis of all procurement for Fifth Air Force accomplished by SMAMA during this fiscal year. It was agreed that, for the rest of this fiscal year, each base would provide SMAMA with funds by means of an obligating authority which is a document authorizing a lump sum against which SMAMA can draw to take care of differences in price between funds cited on purchase requests and actual prices required by vendors.

A TWX was received this date from Fifth Air Force confirming the agreement to furnish funds to S^{MAMA} by obligating authorities. The obligating authorities issued will only provide funds for the differences in actual vendor price over and above specific funds cited on each purchase request.

For some time, new series MPC has been on hand in the Kadena Finance Office with the status of property rather than money. The following action, coordinated with CINCPACREP RYUKYUS, was taken by both Kadena and Naha Air Bases:

Personnel in a transient status on Okinawa, who had old series MPC in their possession, were authorized to convert the old series MPC to U. S. greenback dollars. In addition, a U. S. Treasury check in the amount of the new MPC series on hand was deposited with the USARYIS Comptroller from whom the new series MPC had been obtained. Old series MPC will be turned in in due course.

No difficulties were experienced or are anticipated.



1. /Secret/ Mr. Brown, NAMAP Weapons System, Major Nigh, SAMAP Weapons System, Major Spencer and Capt George, Hq, 5th AF arrived this headquarters on 8 January to discuss and bring this headquarters and the 6431st Air Base Group up to date on matters pertaining to the phasein of C130A aircraft of the 21st T.C.S. The following were matters of interest to Air Supply:

a. AFSD (Air Force Supply Directive) Supply Action. It was learned that NAMAP currently has approximately 1200 Line Items at that AMA for the 21st T.C.S. 850 of these items represented the availability of Depot stocks prior to AFSD. The balance are items that have been shipped in error by SMAMA rather than held for bulk shipment. It was agreed that NAMAP would hold this stock until the AFW account was assigned to Naha and this headquarters would advise date that we desired shipment. Naha Air Base was furnished a list of these items, all being spares. The balance of the AFSD items will be shipped to Naha from the ZI assembly point approximately May or June 1958.

b. Naha Air Base was also furnished a list of consumed items at Ardmore Air Force Base, Oklahoma. This list will be used to requisition items not appearing on the support tables II (Air Frame) III (Engine) and XVI (Comm) or will be screened by the Base Supply Officer and we will request the Weapons Manager to provide automatic shipment. The procedure used depends on the volume after screening.

c. Naha Air Base currently has status decks on all 5 AFSD's and will maintain these decks in order to be aware of items that have been supplied. However, since all 5 AFSD's are consigned to NAMAP. status cards will be forwarded by the ZI AMA's to NAMAP. Mr. Brown stated he would have these cards forwarded on our AFSD's.



Additional unanticipated returnees have been generated in February. However, the sun has broken thru the overcast, and Personnel Pipeline feels a breather is definitely at hand, barring unforeseen developments. Finally, no PCS personnel returning to 2I were delayed more than a very few days.

3. (UNCLAS) Representatives of this office completed a staff assistance visit to Site 54 on 11 February 1958. The purpose of this visit was to establish and instruct personnel in maintaining the Technical Order files. A visit will be made to Site 53 on 14 February 1958 for the same reason. 
5. (UNCLAS) The following technological developments are listed in view of the recent interest displayed by staff sections on these subjects:

a. <u>TM76A-MATADOR MACE</u>: USAF ground to ground missile used by TAC, made by Martin Company, this missile has a span of 29 feet, weighs 7 tons, with a speed of 650 plus MPH. Powered by a J-33 with RATO, the missile has a range of 650 plus miles. Unit is equipped with an inertial guidance system.

b. <u>WS-110A - Weapon System Intercontinental Bomber</u>: A proposed replacement for the B-52 and B-58 bombers, this aircraft is to be produced by North American Aviation. The finished product will fly at MACH 3 at altitudes ranging to 125,000 feet and will be able to cover distances equal to the distance from Chicago to Moscow and return without refueling. This will be made possible by using a new fuel, probably boron. (<u>M</u>/Sgt Hollin/42108)

6. (UNCLAS) The F-86D main landing gear wheel reject rate was 66.1% as of 0800, 14 February 1958. Inspection has revealed that wheels manufactured in 1955 are also cracking due to fatigue and age. (M/Sgt Dykstra/48244)

7. (UNGLAS) Mr. M. F. Newman, General Electric radar Tech Rep, has been relieved from temporary duty of providing technical assistance to the 25th Fighter Interceptor Squadron on the B-4 fire control system and has been directed to return to his primary assignment at Site 55. Fifth Air Force has questioned this headquarters' utilizing Mr. Newman in this capacity and has requested full justification of our action. Our message answer dated 11 February 1958 stated.

a. Demineralized water is <u>not</u> required for B-52 post strike staging missions.

b. B/RB47 missions will not require demineralized water if local water supply is not in excess of 600 parts solids per million.

c. KC 135 and KC 97 missions will require demineralized water when local water supply is in excess of 50 parts solids per million.

Under this policy, Kadena will require demineralized water for only KC 135 and KC 97's. All local projects for construction of demineralized facilities are to be held in abeyance pending publication of the SAC schedule of peace time deployments. (M/Sgt Hollin/42108)



1. (UNCLAS) Accuracy in Transportation Requirements Forecasting.

a. The following important USAF message was received 27 March 1958 thru PACAF.

"UNCLAS/AFMTP-RA-1, ALMAJCOM 529/58. This message in four (4) parts. Part I. Of increasing concern to the JCS and this headquarters is the number of changes occuring to states airlift requirements. Such changes occurring after an allocation have a cumulative effect on the MATS operation to the extent that schedules are disrupted, thereby affecting the air logistical support of Air Force and other Services overseas activities, or the payload capability of aircraft cannot be effectively utilized. In addition, such changes have a more profound and determinable effect in terms of actual expenditure of funds which could have been avoided through proper programming. Part II. Submission of changes to airlift requirements indicates a definite need for improved staff programming and planning to insure that requirements as submitted represent the actual requirement. Continued changes, either increase or decrease, cannot be sustained if a reliable air logistic support is to be achieved and Air Force funds effectively utilized. The need for special type airlifts is recognized, however, the continued and frequent changes to these requirements cannot be reconciled with adequate and appropriate guidances in planning and programming such airlifts. Part III. Effective immediately, this headquarters will not accept requests for airlift or changes to airlift requirements after an allocation except for urgent emergency requirements which cannot be accomplished by any other method. 1. SHIPMENT OF QK338A MAGNETRONS FOR FPS-6 HEIGHT FINDER RADAR. (SECRET) This command has experienced considerable difficulty in maintaining adequate stockage of QK338 Magnetron tubes. Shipments of these tubes are not being made often enough or in sufficient quantities to satisfy our requirements. This headquarters has taken action to effect immediate airlift of twenty-eight (28) each tubes from Dayton AFD. Thirty (30) each have been shipped by surface transportation but have not been received to date. Action has been taken to determine ETA Okinawa for these tubes. In addition, 5th Air Force has requested PACAF to initiate necessary action to effect shipment of at least sixty (60) each subject tubes via priority airlift, and to follow up with an immediate surface shipment, with priority assigned, that will deliver them to this area in a reasonable amount of time. Fifth Air Force has advised PACAF that, unless action is initiated to insure larger and faster shipments of subject tubes, we will continue to experience difficulty. (S/Sgt Stover/48102)

2. <u>POSSIBLE CAUSE OF MACNETRON FAILURES - SITE 56, YUZA DAKE</u>. (SECRET) Representatives of this office visited Site 56 on 14 April 1958 to determine the cause of the recent Magnetron, QK-338-A, failures at that site. It was found that the clamp and washers that hold the magnetron and the attached waverguide were slightly bent. This caused a pressure on the magnetron windown causing it to crack. 1. <u>GROUNDING OF RF-84F'S FOR SUSPECTED TAIL STRUCTURE DEFICIENCY</u> (Conf): On 18 April 1958, all RF-84F's of the 15th Tactical Recomnaissance Squadron were grounded by direction of 67th Tactical Recomnaissance Wing due to suspected tail structure deficiency. As of 0720I hours 21 April 1958, all aircraft had been inspected and three aircraft were found to have same deficiency. The rest of the aircraft were placed back in commission with the exception of one aircraft AOCP, one aircraft in periodic maintenance, and one aircraft in unscheduled maintenance. a. AMC does not consider it feasible to transfer Army Excess Vehicles to the Air Force on a reimbursable basis. The reason for this is that "M" series vehicles are in long supply within Air Force Supply.

b. A program is presently under way whereby the Air Force will transfer "M" series vehicles to the Army in <u>trade</u> for commercial type vehicles. This program will be implemented 1 July 1958 on a phased basis. Local Army Ordnance has no word on this as yet. (Major Huckabay/44204)

1. <u>REPAIR OF F-6 REFUELING UNITS (Unclas)</u>: A visit was made to this headquarters on 24 April 1958 by CWO O'Bier from SAMAP. The purpose was to determine the action being taken to have ten each F-6 refueling units at Kadena and Naha Air Bases restored to serviceable condition. Mr. O'Bier was satisfied that our action to have the structural repairs accomplished by Rycom Ordnance Depot prior to having a SAMAP team reline the tanks was adequate. (T/Sgt Caffrey/ 44203)

2. <u>INSTALLATION OF CUMMINS GENERATOR MODIFICATION (Unclas)</u>: During his visit to this headquarters on 24 April 1958, Mr. O'Bier suggested that action be taken to have the 24 each Cummins Modification Kits at Naha Air Base installed prior to receipt of all the backup parts in Base Supply. c. Col Stover, Transportation AMFPA, indicated that he was going to recommend that a direct flight (MATS) from the ZI to Okinawa be initiated for the purpose of hauling freight. (Maj Huckabay/44204)

2. <u>RECEIPT OF AIR SPACES FOR PCS TRAVEL TO ZI DURING JUNE (Unclas)</u>: We have been advised by 5th Air Force that Army, in line with Department of Defense procedure, has been requested to procure 487 air spaces for June travel of AF accompanied personnel (members with dependents) from Okinawa to Travis. We have received 243 DoD Joint-Military Transportation Committee allocated air spaces for June travel of unaccompanied personnel. We have a total requirement of 504 air spaces for June unaccompanied personnel. Therefore, 261 additional spaces have been requested from PACAF by Priority message this date. These 261 spaces are to be USAF purchased. Past experience indicates we will receive them. (CWO Vincent/42133)

3. IG INSPECTING OF AIRCRAFT CONTROL AND WARNING UNITS (Unclas): T/Sgt Crenshaw of this office has been assisting the IG in his inspection of Aircraft Control and Warning units. An inspection was completed at Site P-54 (Kume) Friday, 25 April. The next scheduled unit is Site P-55 (Okino), Monday, 28 April. (T/Sgt Crenshaw/40130)

1. RADAR OUT OF SERVICE STATUS REPORT FOR APRIL (Unclas): The Radar cut of Commission for Parts-Radar/Radio Not Functioning Properly status report for the month of April is as follows:

> Radar out of Commission for Parts (RCCP) - 0.087% Radar/Radio Not Functioning Properly (RNFP) - 1.54%

The slight increase in ROCP from 0.00% to 0.087% was primarily due to technical difficulties at Site P-56. These difficulties were caused by improper fitting between the magnetron, waveguide, and pulse transformer. This improper fitting caused a binding of the magnetron, thereby causing breakage of magnetron radio frequency window. This difficulty was finally corrected by replacing the waveguide section, marmon clamp, and washers which hold the waveguide. The RNFP rate continues to improve. (S/Sgt Stover/48102)

2. <u>CANCELLATION OF INCOMING VEHICLE SHIPMENTS (Unclas)</u>: Due to changes in vehicle requirements for bases of this command, it was found that many vehicles being shipped to Okinawa through redistribution against the 31 December 1957 Vehicle Requirements Report are not now required. To prevent the generation of additional excesses, these incoming shipments have been reviewed against current requirements. Wherever possible, vehicles due in against a dead requirement were diverted to fill a need existing in another organization or base. In addition, very poor supply support is being provided by CONUS depots. Four MA-2's are presently deadlined for parts. One additional unit will be deadlined in approximately two weeks. 1. USAF FY-59 FOLICY ON TRAVEL OF ACCOMPANIED PERSON EL FROM OKINAWA TO ZI (Unclas):

a. The following is extracted from CINCPACAF message PFMTR-T 36674, dated 122217Z:

"USAF policy effective 1 July 1958 requires that all Air Force sponsored personnel travel to and from the CONUS by air. Only these individuals and/or family units who refuse to fly will be provided water transportation. In this connection be advised that principals may be required to fly if reporting dates and other exigencies of the service so dictate."

b. Headquarters PACAF has rebutted the above USAF policy as follows:

"Your policy that only those individuals and/or family units who refuse to fly will be moved by ocean transportation to and from the US announced in your message is concurred in. However, we do take exception to your arbitrary determination of our July and August inbound to CONUS water recuirements for the following reasons: (A) The number of dependents that refuse air travel from the PACAF area to the CONUS is conservatively estimated to exceed the 15 per cent indicated in Part II of referenced message. We are now determining the exact percentage but estimate it to be in excess of 50 per cent. (B) Reporting date to new assignments will force sponsors to return and leave their dependents in the theater. (C) Occupation of government quarters by dependents subsequent to sponsor's departure. (D) This in turn will cause a reduction in the number of dependents that can travel concurrently to the theater. (D) An agreement between the Japanese and U. S. Governments prevents dependents from remaining in Japan subsequant to a sponsor's permanent change of station. (E) Dependents that have a defensible reason for refusing to fly may be required to accept airlift in order to travel with their sponsor, thus creating a subject for complaints to Congressmen and the Inspector General. (F) Last but not least are adverse effect on morale and the reenlistment (CWO Vincent/42133) rate."

Request your headquarters give maximum publicity to the policy of this headquarters that all personnel are required to make return transportation reservations by completing MATS Form 53 upon arrival at a TDY destination or not later than six Days prior to expected date of departure which ever is sooner. For your information travelers departing from this headquarters for TDY your station will be informed of this policy. We suggest that travel orders contain a statement to this effect." 2. CONTRACT TECHNICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL PROGRAM FOR F-102 AIR-CRAFT (Secret):

a. Upon request by this headquarters, Fifth Air Force has reinstated the requirement for one each contract technician on Air-Communications-Navigation equipment on the F-102 aircraft for the 16th FIS.

PARTS SUPPORT FOR CUMMINS LOOKW GENERATORS (Unclas): A staff visit was made to Naha Air Base on the 4th of June for the purpose of determining if Ease Supply was forwarding requisitions for Cummins Generator parts to Rycom Depot. It was found that in several instances such requisitions were forwarded to SMAMA. The proper people were notified and corrective action taken to assure that parts are obtained in the future from the local Army Depot. Blount, General Services Administration, San Francisco, California, arrived Okinawa on 5 June 1958 on an annual assistance visit and to brief all personnel concerned relative to requisitioning procedures, etc., by overseas activities from General Services Administration via transceiver. 2. MEETING ON PARTS SUPPORT FOR CUMMINS GENERATORS (Unclas): A conference was held at 313th Air Division Headquarters on 5 June 1958. at the request of the Division Materiel Officer. Those in attendance included representatives from the Division Materiel Office, Naha Base Supply, Naha Installations Squadron, 313th Installations, and Rycom Depot., The purpose of the meeting was to determine action to be taken on a quantity of requisitions submitted to Rycom Depot for Cummins Generator Parts by Naha Base Supply. It was discovered during a routine supply assistance visit that Naha Base Supply was requisitioning 27 sets of parts for use in the 12,000-hour check and rebuild of Cummins 100KW Generators. SUPPLY ASSISTANCE VISIT ON WEAPONS CARRIER ENGINES (Unclas): A request was received on 6 June 1958 to assist the maintenance and supply activities at Kadena AB in resolving difficulties encountered in obtaining 15 each rebuilt engines from Army Ordnance Depot for use in 3/4-ton weapons carriers. A supply assistance visit was immediately made. The Base Supply Property Accounting Officer was contacted. as well as representatives of the motor vehicle maintenance shop. It was learned through checking base supply records that 15 engines had been turned in for rebuild and replacements were not received. resulting in excessive VOCPs for 3/4-ton trucks. Army Ordnance representatives were contacted and it was learned that the engines had been turned in to them; however, the requisition which was to accompany the turn-in was not received. Arrangements were made with the Property Accounting Officer to prepare a new requisition to be hand carried to Army on 9 June, at which time the engines can be picked up. 2. STATUS OF VEHICULAR EXCESSES AT KADENA AB (Unclas): A visit was made to Area 1 excess yard at Kadena AB on 5 June 1958. The purpose of this visit was to ascertain if vehicles in excess storage were being properly reported, if non-critical, uneconomically reparable vehicles were being processed to disposal using authority contained in Volume XIII of AFM 67-1, and to determine if incoming vehicles were being properly processed to the requiring organization. An inventory was conducted and 61 vehicles were found in the excess storage area. 1. MATERIEL VISIT TO CHIA-YI (Secret):

a. Representatives of this directorate visited Chia-Yi on 9 June to coordinate on logistic support matters. Quarters and subsistence are excellent. Morale is very high. Supply support is generally satisfactory.

b. However, refueling equipment there is obsolete. The F-2, 2,000-gallon refueling tank trailers are old. They have a very slow dispensing rate, although serviceable. For F-100 aircraft, 2,000 gallons will not always service two aircraft. This is pre-positioned equipment, a responsibility of ATF 13 (Prov).

c. F-6 or MJl units are needed. These larger, faster pumping units would service three to six F-100 aircraft without return to fill stands. They will rapidly pump fuel into aircraft (600 gallons per minute). This would afford minimum turn-around and vulnerability time.

d. Appropriate recommendation has been forwarded to higher headquarters to amend Consolidated Materiel Distribution Objective (CMDO) documents to pre-position MJl fuel servicing tankers at Chia-Yi.

e. Liquid oxygen supply has been a bothersome problem. Operations Plan 124-58 fixes the responsibility for liquid oxygen supply on ATF 13 (Prov), working with Chinese National Air Force to support our deployed units. However, ATF 13 (Prov) and CNAF do not have capability at Chia-Yi to support 44th FBS now deployed there. As a result, a 50gallon liquid oxygen cart has to be flown from Kadena AB (18th FBW) every other day. This is being done, but it is not entirely satisfactory.

f. Therefore, appropriate action has been recommended to Fifth Air Force and ATF 13 (Prov) to correct this deficiency. (Lt Col Morgan/ 44204)



Purpose: To supplement current and future on-the-job training programs of this headquarters, ultimately to raise the overall skill level of Ryukyuan employees through the selection of employees for training and giving them the opportunity to acquire the technical and vocational skills necessary for normal progression to fully qualified journeymen and supervisory positions.

Prchibitions and Restrictions: (1) JNs will be utilized only as instructors. (2) JNs will not displace Ryukyuan employees nor deter employment of Ryukyuans. (3) USCAR will be kept informed of developments and progress. This will be accomplished through the medium of the Joint Industrial Vocational Training Council. The JN instructors are limited to one (1) year in the Ryukyus with a possibility of having contracts renewed upon approval by USCAR.

Fhases of the AVO Program are (1) determination, analysis and documentation (2) development of units of instruction (3) Instruction (4) Evaluation.

Twelve (12) Japanese instructors are authorized. These will be assigned as one (1) chief, two (2) principal instructors and nine (9) journeymen instructors. These employees will have approximately the same rights and privileges as will present Filipino personnel. (Mr. Walker - 49235)

With the above schedule, there are only nine (9) days between the close of the application period and the date the first PACAF selection board will convene. Experience had indicated that applicants are slow to apply during the first part of the program, and that the majority of applications arrive during the last two (2) weeks of the period. If an application arrives in Headquarters PACAF after the board for that service year group has adjourned, Headquarters PACAF has no alternative but to forward the application to Headquarters USAF without command priority. Part III: Since the beginning of this application period, numerous applications containing administrative errors have been received in this headquarters. Correction of such errors is time-consuming and causes unnecessary delays in processing of the applications. 2. <u>AIRMAN PROFICIENCY TEST SCORING SYSTEM (Unclas)</u>: At the present time, APT scores are rated in one (1) of three (3) categories: A(Passing), B(Borderline), and C(Failing). Categories A and C are self-explanatory. Commanders have the prerogative of determing whether airmen who score in Category B should be retested or meet a classification board to determine whether or not he possesses the knowledge required for award of the AFSC. A query has been received from Headquarters Pacific Air Force through Headquarters Fifth Air Force concerning the retention of the present system or returning to the "pass or fail" system. This headquarters recommended returning to the "pass or fail" system. This system would not only cut down on board actions, but would eliminate any possible dissension caused by some personnel being selected for board action and others with identical scores not being selected. 3. <u>MONTHLY HOUSING MEETING (Unclas)</u>: As a result of the monthly housing meeting, conducted on 21 April 1958, it was determined to travel a total of forty (40) Air Force personnel on the July "7-A", to arrive Okinawa approximately 7 July 1958. Of this total, thirty-five (35) were airmen and five (5) were officers. All officers were those assigned to Kadena Air Base. 6. AIRMAN MANNING (Unclas): Since August 1957, this command has experienced a continuing reduction in airman personnel manning due to early returns for discharge, curtailment of personnel in surplus AFSC's, curtailment of surplus airmen in units that were discontinued and forced reduction in pipeline input. Consequently, our manning has dropped to approximately 100%. The resumption of normal input from the Zone of Interior, however, will not offset certain future projected losses. Within the next several months, we must expect that our "effective" manning will be considerably less than 100%. Therefore, it becomes increasingly important to encourage extensions of overseas tours, especially those of key airmen. Personnel serving in AFSC's that are short command wide should be encouraged to extend their overseas tour in accordance with AFM 35-11. Every section should insure that manning documents reflect accurately, by numbers and AFSC, the most realistic distribution of available manpower spaces in current and future CMOP's. (Maj Watters/44138)

7. <u>REENLISTMENT (Unclas)</u>: A recent PACAF interim change to AFR 39-14 precludes personnel possessing AFSC's which are listed as "surplus" from taking "short discharges" for the purpose of immediately reenlisting to fill their own vacancy. (This restriction can be expected to drastically reduce a heretofore excellent reenlistment rate within the command. Under previous ground rules for the computation of the reenlistment rate, the majority of such individuals would have to be considered as eligible to reenlist at the time they return to the CONUS). Coincident with the above the Reenlistment Rate Report (RCS: PACAF - P40) has been discontinued and the Monthly Base Reenlistment Meetings are no longer mandatory. Kadema and Naha Air Base reenlistment figures will continue to be received by 313PC-A in May and Jume 58, and may be continued beyond 1 July 1958. Both Kadema and Naha Air Bases have been encouraged to continue the monthly meetings and concentrate on personnel who possess other than surplus AFSC's. (Maj Watters/44138)

The following categories are subject to mandatory review. An "as of" date of 30 June 1958 will apply to age factors.

a. All pilots thirty-five (35) years of age and over who do not have a senior pilot rating.

b. All pilots and senior pilots forty-three (43) years of age and over who do not have a command pilot rating.

c. All navigators and aircraft observers thirty-five (35) years of age and over who do not have their respective senior ratings.

d. All navigators and aircraft observers forty-three (43) years of age and over who have not accrued 3000 hours of creditable flying experience.

NOTE: Single rated aircraft observers who are rated to perform duty only as Aircraft Performance Engineers (AFSC 4324) or as Armament Operations Officer (AFSC 3244) will not be reported.

Major Commanders may waive the mandatory reporting of rated officers provided officer concerned has logged at least 100 hours jet flying time. Major Commanders may also waive mandatory reporting provisions when officer concerned has been assigned primary duties as an aircrew member for a period of at least six (6) months immediately prior to 30 June 1958 and the performance of such duty is considered satisfactory.

In addition to the mandatory review, all other rated officers will be screened and those who fall within the following categories will be reported.

a. Those rated officers who have sufficient years of rated service to be eligible for an advanced aeronautical rating, but do not possess the additional prerequisites for such ratings.

To assist in this evaluation, each officer concerned will be required to include a statement in his indorsement to the effect that proficiency is or is not being maintained in his aircraft observer or navigator specialty. Breaks in service and fortunes of assignment are significant; however, continued retention on flying status cannot be justified on the basis of these factors alone.

Review of Air Force officer's records by the Central Flight Status Selection Board does not reflect unfavorably on the individual, nor does it mean that he will automatically be removed from flying status. 
